# Mark and record valuables

- **Engrave** tools and equipment with initials or add unique identifiers.
- At the change of the season **take a video** of the workshop or garage.
- **Take photos** and keep serial numbers.
- Consider **invisible property marking** (such as UV pens) so you can identify stolen items, even if the thief has tried to conceal or alter them.

## Be mindful of social media

- Avoid posting about new gear or big deliveries (don't create a shopping list for the criminals).
- **Don't share** travel plans online.

# Protect light vehicles and trailers

- **Store** quad bikes, trailers, and utes out of sight or in locked sheds.
- **Use** wheel clamps, hitch locks, and consider GPS trackers.
